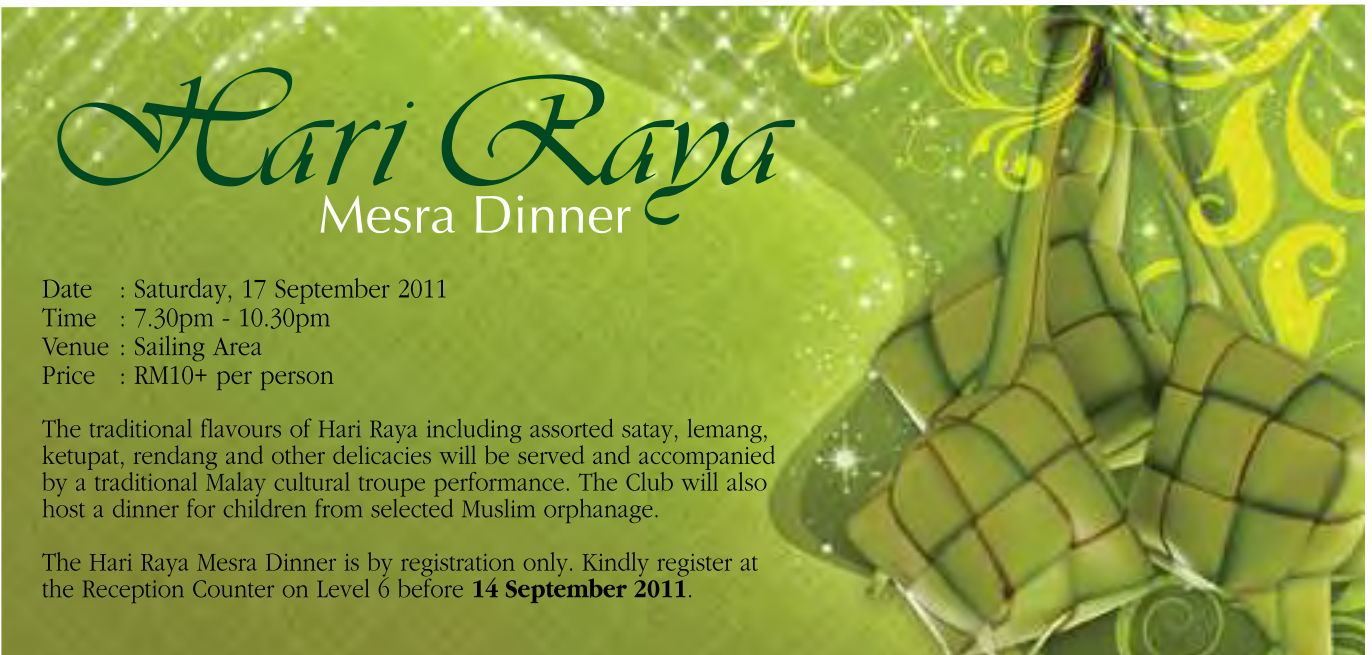

Onshore Fishing (Day) Competition 15 MAY 2011

Yes, it has started again! The Angling Section had its first fishing contest for the new season on 15 May at 9.00am along the beach beyond the Snake Temple.

Past year's prize winners had a lot to live up to, as they were seen flashing their new rods and reels to intimidate the other challengers. Overall, there was a marked improvement in the casting skills of the members, but poor Helen still needed to walk into the surf to get that extra foot of distance, and nearly lost a slipper in the process!

Another notable sight were the umbrellas ~ a whole row of them along the beach-front! Some were purpose-designed setups, while most were the DIY-type made mainly of bamboo pole extensions. It didn't really matter what style of umbrella it was, as they provided the much needed shelter for the anglers.

Back to the fishing scene, the usual strange assortment of baits were at hand – the prawns (a fishing standard), cockles (a bit more exotic), week old prawns (smelly!!), the ever popular Kembong fish and even some closely guarded 'hor fun' baits. With anticipation running high, the anglers took their position and waited for the starting signal.

The tide was still rising at 9.30am, and within the first few minutes of the competition, over 200gm of fish were reeled in, signaling a bountiful catch. Offshore Trip To Muka Head 22 MAY 2011

Land... Ahoy! Or was it Muka Head ahead? The weather was fine when the 33 anglers arrived at Muka Head, and everyone was hoping for a 'good' catch.

Earlier in the day, the anglers gathered at 7.30am for the boat and group draws at the Teluk Bahang jetty. We were pleasantly surprised by the new concrete jetty, thus avoiding minor heart attacks previously caused by the many shaky/holey wooden planks of the old jetty. Eventually, three boats carrying 2 teams each were launched towards Muka Head.

The other was Stephen Ong, huffing and puffing with a possible BIG Ikan

Pari at the other end, only to lose the fight in the end due to 'equipment failure'! But again, fishing luck held out, because he then caught a huge 'flat head'. We didn't know the actual name of the fish Stephen caught, but because it had a flat head unlike Stephen, we decided to christen it as such.

When it came to lunch, the conversation centred not so much on the fishing, but more on the huge, huge curry prawns, the big curried squid, and the deep fried chicken washed down with an endless supply of sweet rose lemon syrup drink.

Despite the food distraction, the hardcore anglers were left hungering for longer fishing time and dreamily wished for a full 4 - 5 hours fishing expedition. So who's joining us the next time?!

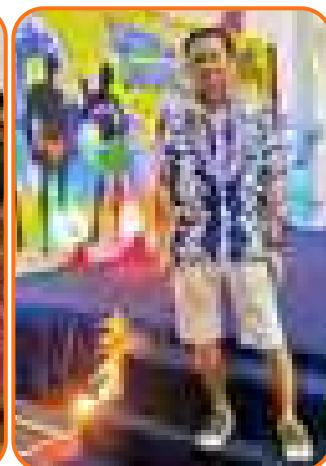

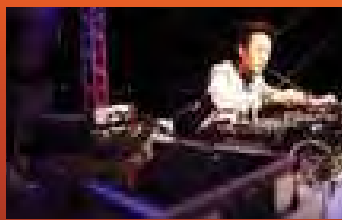

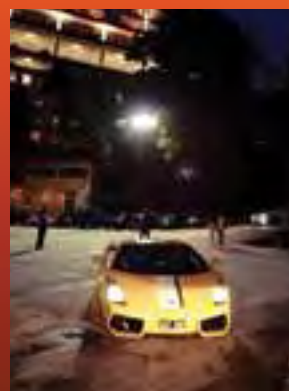
FULL MOON PARTY

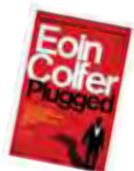

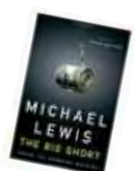
